Redhouse Farm, based at Dunham Massey, near Altrincham in Cheshire, is transforming its old milking parlour into a theatrical ensemble of spooky cottages, pumpkin catapults, a quad barrel train, pumpkin balloon typhoon and the most frightful of its delights, its very own snarling, growling 'Beast'. The old milking parlour was abandoned years ago and has a history packed full of deadly mishaps and terrible misfortunes, so be on your guard or you will find yourself being well and truly spooked.

Guests can be treated to witches brew soup, worm cakes and other creepy delights, but the North West Farm Tourism Initiative is warning visitors that whilst some things are pretend, the spiders are most definitely real!! Fancy dress parades will take place at 5 p.m. on the first weekend and at both 4 p.m. and 7 p.m. during Halloweek.

A visit costs £x per adult and £x per child, with a family ticket priced at £x. Opening hours are noon till 6 p.m. on October 15-16 and noon to 8 p.m. from October 22-31.
